Dealing with bereavement in schools



It's a sad reality that many schools will at some point probably have to deal with the death of a pupil, parent or member of staff. This can be very difficult for everyone involved and can be hard to know how best to approach the subject of death and loss in an age-appropriate way and how to help children and young people to process the feelings they may be experiencing.

"By talking about death and dying as a normal and natural subject, it can help enable bereaved children to have better coping skills. Giving children support from familiar, trusted adults, will mean that most will not need professional help. Schools are well placed to provide this support." (Child Bereavement UK)

Some of the books explore and include Christian beliefs about death and others are non-religious.











